SECTION 1 - GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION

- **Do not provide responses to items in this section unless specifically and expressly required.**

1.1 PURPOSE

The Office of State Procurement (OSP) issues this Request for Qualifications (RFQ) on behalf of the Arkansas Insurance Department (AID) to contract with actuarial firms to provide actuarial and consulting services and to assist AID with issues affecting all lines of business.

The Arkansas Insurance Department, as part of its continuing regulatory responsibilities to the consumers of the State of Arkansas, will utilize the contracted actuarial firms for services such as statutory examinations, financial analysis, and audits of the State's regulated insurance firms.

1.2 TYPE OF CONTRACT

- A. A Term contract will be awarded to up to three (3) vendors.
- B. The term of these contracts **shall** be for one (1) year. The anticipated starting date for the contracts is November 14, 2016. Upon mutual agreement by the vendor and agency, the contracts may be renewed by OSP on a year-to-year basis, for up to six (6) additional one-year terms or a portion thereof.
- C. The total term of each contract **shall not** be more than seven (7) years.

1.3 ISSUING AGENCY

OSP, as the issuing office, is the sole point of contact throughout this solicitation.

1.4 BID OPENING LOCATION

1.5 DEFINITION OF REQUIREMENT

- A. The words "**must**" and "**shall**" signify a Requirement of this solicitation and that vendor's agreement to and compliance with that item is mandatory.
- B. Exceptions taken to any Requirement in this *Bid Solicitation*, whether submitted in the vendor's response or in subsequent correspondence, **shall** cause the vendor's response to be disqualified.
- C. Vendor may request exceptions to NON-mandatory items. Any such request **must** be declared on, or as an attachment to, the appropriate section's *Agreement and Compliance Page* in the *Response Packet*. Vendor **must** clearly explain the requested exception and should reference the specific solicitation item number to which the exception applies. (See *Agreement and Compliance Page*.)

1.6 DEFINITION OF TERMS

- A. The State Procurement Official has made every effort to use industry-accepted terminology in this *Bid Solicitation* and will attempt to further clarify any point of an item in question as indicated in *Clarification of Bid Solicitation*.
- B. The words "bidder" and "vendor" are used synonymously in this document.
- C. The terms "Request for Qualifications", "RFQ" and "Bid Solicitation" are used synonymously in this document.

1.7 RESPONSE DOCUMENTS**A. Original Response Packet**

1. The original *Response Packet* **must** be submitted on or before the bid opening date and time.
2. The *Response Packet* should be clearly marked "Original" and **must** include the following:
 - a. Original signed *Response Signature Page*. (See *Response Signature Page*.)
 - b. Original signed *Agreement and Compliance Pages*. (See *Agreement and Compliance Pages*.)
 - c. Original signed *Proposed Subcontractors Form*. (See *Subcontractors*.)
 - d. Specialty Listing Page section included in the *Response Packet*.
 - e. Response to the *Information for Evaluation* section included in the *Response Packet*.
 - f. Other documents and/or information as may be expressly required in this *Bid Solicitation*.
3. The following items should be submitted in the original *Response Packet*.
 - a. EO 98-04 Disclosure Form. (See *Standard Terms and Conditions, #27. Disclosure*.)
 - b. Copy of Vendor's *Equal Opportunity Policy*. (See *Equal Opportunity Policy*.)
4. **DO NOT** include any other documents or ancillary information, such as a cover letter or promotional/marketing information.

B. Pricing is not requested for this solicitation and **must not** be submitted with the bidder's response. (See *Pricing*.)

C. Additional Copies and Redacted Copy of the Response Packet

In addition to the original *Response Packet*, the following items should be submitted:

1. *Additional Copies of the Response Packet*
 - a. Three (3) complete hard copies (marked "COPY") of the *Response Packet*.
 - b. Four (4) electronic copies of the *Response Packet*, preferably on flash drives. CDs will also be acceptable.
 - c. All additional hard copies and electronic copies **must** be identical to the original hard copy. In case of a discrepancy, the original hard copy **shall** govern.
 - d. If OSP requests additional copies of the response, the copies **must** be delivered within twenty-four (24) hours of request.
2. One (1) redacted copy (marked "REDACTED") the original *Response Packet*, preferably on a flash drive. A CD will also be acceptable. (See *Proprietary Information*.)

1.8 ORGANIZATION OF RESPONSE DOCUMENTS

- A. It is strongly recommended that vendors adhere to the following format and suggestions when preparing their Response.
- B. The original *Response Packet* and all copies should be arranged in the following order.

 - *All Agreement and Compliance Pages.*
 - *Proposed Subcontractors Form.*
 - *Specialty Listing Page*

 - *Equal Opportunity Policy.*
 - Other documents and/or information as may be expressly required in this *Bid Solicitation*. Label documents and/or information so as to reference the *Bid Solicitation's* item number.
 - Response to the *Information for Evaluation* section of the *Response Packet*.

1.9 CLARIFICATION OF BID SOLICITATION

- A. Vendors may submit written questions requesting clarification of information contained in this *Bid Solicitation*. Written questions **must** be submitted by 4:00 p.m., Central Time on July 13, 2016. Submit written questions by email to the OSP buyer as shown on page one (1) of this *Bid Solicitation*.
1. For each question submitted, vendor should reference the specific solicitation item number to which the question refers.
 2. Vendors' written questions will be consolidated and responded to by the State. The State's consolidated written response is anticipated to be posted to the OSP website by the close of business on July 19, 2016.
- B. Vendors may contact the OSP buyer with procurement-related questions at any time prior to the bid opening.
- C. Answers to verbal questions may be given as a matter of courtesy and **must** be evaluated at vendor's risk.

1.10 RESPONSE SIGNATURE PAGE

- A. An official authorized to bind the vendor(s) to a resultant contract **must** sign the *Response Signature Page* included in the *Response Packet*.
- B. Vendor's signature on this page **shall** signify vendor's agreement that either of the following **shall** cause the vendor's response to be disqualified:
- Additional terms or conditions submitted intentionally or inadvertently.
 - Any exception that conflicts with a Requirement of this *Bid Solicitation*.

1.11 AGREEMENT AND COMPLIANCE PAGES

- A. Vendor **must** sign all *Agreement and Compliance Pages* relevant to each section of the *Bid Solicitation Document*. The *Agreement and Compliance Pages* are included in the *Response Packet*.
- B. Vendor's signature on these pages **shall** signify agreement to and compliance with all Requirements within the designated section.

1.12 SUBCONTRACTORS

- A. Vendor **must** complete, sign and submit the *Proposed Subcontractors Form* included in the *Response Packet*.
- B. Additional subcontractor information may be required or requested in following sections of this *Bid Solicitation* or in the *Information for Evaluation* section provided in the *Response Packet*. **Do not** attach any additional information to the *Proposed Subcontractors Form*.
- C. AID **shall** have the right to approve all subcontractors.

1.13 PRICING

Pricing will be negotiated with the apparent successful vendors per project. Vendors **must not** include any pricing in their response. Should the hard copies or electronic copies of their *Response Packet* contain any pricing, the response **shall** be disqualified.

1.14 PRIME CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY

- A. A joint response submitted by two or more vendors is acceptable. However, a single vendor **must** be identified as the prime contractor.
- B. The prime contractor **shall** be held responsible for the contract and **shall** be the sole point of contact.

1.15 PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

- A. Submission documents pertaining to this *Bid Solicitation* become the property of the State and are subject to the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).
- B. One (1) complete copy of the submission documents from which any proprietary information has been redacted should be submitted on a flash drive in the *Response Packet*. A CD is also acceptable.
- C. Except for the redacted information, the redacted copy **must** be identical to the original hard copy, reflecting the same pagination as the original and showing the space from which information was redacted.
- D. The vendor **shall** be responsible for identifying all proprietary information and for ensuring the electronic copy is protected against restoration of redacted data.
- E. The redacted copy **shall** be open to public inspection under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) without further notice to the vendor.
- F. If a redacted copy of the submission documents is not provided with vendor's response packet, a copy of the non-redacted documents, with the exception of financial data, **shall** be released in response to any request made under the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).
- G. If the State deems redacted information to be subject to FOIA, the vendor will be contacted prior to release of the documents.

1.16 CAUTION TO VENDORS

- A. Prior to any contract award, all communication concerning this *Bid Solicitation* **must** be addressed through OSP.
- B. Vendor **must not** alter any language in any solicitation document provided by the State.
- C. All official documents and correspondence related to this solicitation **shall** be included as part of the resultant contract.
- D. Responses **must** be submitted only in the English language.
- E. The State **shall** have the right to award or not award a contract, if it is in the best interest of the State to do so.
- F. Vendor **must** provide clarification of any information in their response documents as requested by OSP.
- G. Qualifications **must** meet or exceed the required specifications as set forth in this *Bid Solicitation*.
- H. Vendors may submit multiple responses.

1.17 REQUIREMENT OF ADDENDUM

- A. This *Bid Solicitation* **shall** be modified only by an addendum written and authorized by OSP.
- B. An addendum posted within three (3) calendar days prior to the bid opening **shall** extend the bid opening and may or may not include changes to the Bid Solicitation.
- C. The vendor **shall** be responsible for checking the OSP website, <http://www.arkansas.gov/dfa/procurement/bids/index.php>, for any and all addenda up to bid opening.

1.18 QUALIFICATION AND AWARD PROCESS**A. Successful Vendor(s) Selection**

1. The ranking of vendors **shall** be determined by the total score each *Response* receives in evaluation. Responses that do not receive a minimum weighted score of 300 may not move forward in the solicitation process. The top three (3) scoring vendors will be the anticipated successful vendors.

B. Negotiations

1. If the agency so chooses, it **shall** have the right to enter discussions with any of the apparent qualified vendors to further define contract details. All negotiations **shall** be conducted at the sole discretion of the State. The State **shall** solely determine the items to be negotiated.
2. If the agency and vendor cannot reach an agreement regarding contractual matters, including pricing, the State **shall** declare the vendor as non-responsive.

C. Anticipation to Award

1. Once the anticipated successful vendors have been determined, the anticipated awards will be posted on the OSP website at http://www.arkansas.gov/dfa/procurement/pro_intent.php.
2. The anticipated awards will be posted for a period of fourteen (14) days prior to the issuance of a contract. Vendors and agencies are cautioned that these are preliminary results only, and a contract will not be issued prior to the end of the fourteen day posting period.
3. OSP **shall** have the right to waive the policy of Anticipation to Award when it is in the best interest of the State.
4. It is the vendor's responsibility to check the OSP website for the posting of an anticipated award.

D. Issuance of a Contract

1. Any resultant contracts of this *Bid Solicitation* **shall** be subject to State approval processes which may include Legislative review and approval.
2. A State Procurement Official will be responsible for award and administration of any resulting contract(s).

1.19 MINORITY BUSINESS POLICY**A. Minority is defined by Arkansas Code Annotated § 15-4-303 as a lawful permanent resident of this State who is:**

- African American
- American Indian
- Asian American
- Hispanic American
- Pacific Islander American
- A Service Disabled Veterans as designated by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs

- B. The Arkansas Economic Development Commission conducts a certification process for minority businesses and disabled veterans. The vendor's Certification Number should be included on the vendor's *Response Signature Page*.

1.20 EQUAL OPPORTUNITY POLICY

- A. In compliance with Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-104, OSP is required to have a copy of the vendor's *Equal Opportunity (EO) Policy* prior to issuing a contract award.
- B. *EO Policies* may be submitted in electronic format to the following email address: eeopolicy.osp@dfa.arkansas.gov, but should also be included as a hardcopy accompanying the solicitation response.
- C. The submission of an *EO Policy* to OSP is a one-time Requirement. Vendors are responsible for providing updates or changes to their respective policies, and for supplying *EO Policies* upon request to other State agencies that must also comply with this statute.
- D. Vendors who are not required by law by to have an *EO Policy* **must** submit a written statement to that effect.

1.21 PROHIBITION OF EMPLOYMENT OF ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS

- A. Pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-105, prior to the award of a contract, selected vendor(s) **must** have a current certification on file with OSP stating that they do not employ or contract with illegal immigrants.
- B. OSP will notify the selected vendor(s) prior to award if their certification has expired or is not on file. Instructions for completing the certification process will be provided to the vendor(s) at that time.

1.22 PAST PERFORMANCE

In accordance with provisions of State Procurement Law, specifically OSP Rule R5:19-11-230(b) (1), a vendor's past performance with the State may be used to determine if the vendor is "responsible". Responses submitted by vendors determined to be non-responsible **shall** be disqualified.

1.23 COMPLIANCE WITH THE STATE SHARED TECHNICAL ARCHITECTURE PROGRAM

The respondent's solution **must** comply with the State's shared Technical Architecture Program which is a set of policies and standards that can be viewed at: <http://www.dis.arkansas.gov/policiesStandards/Pages/default.aspx>. Only those standards which are fully promulgated or have been approved by the Governor's Office apply to this solution.

1.24 VISA ACCEPTANCE

- A. Awarded vendor should have the capability of accepting the State's authorized VISA Procurement Card (p-card) as a method of payment.
- B. Price changes or additional fee(s) **shall not** be levied against the State when accepting the p-card as a form of payment.
- C. VISA is not the exclusive method of payment.

1.25 PUBLICITY

- A. Vendors **shall not** issue a news release pertaining to this *Bid Solicitation* or any portion of the project without OSP's prior written approval.
- B. Failure to comply with this Requirement **shall** be cause for a vendor's response to be disqualified.

1.26 RESERVATION

The State **shall not** pay costs incurred in the preparation of a response.

SECTION 2 – MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- **Do not provide responses to items in this section unless specifically and expressly required.**

2.1 INTRODUCTION

The Office of State Procurement (OSP) has issued this Request for Qualifications (RFQ) on behalf of the Arkansas Insurance Department (AID) to contract with actuarial firms to provide actuarial and consulting services and to assist AID with issues affecting all lines of business.

The Arkansas Insurance Department, as part of its continuing regulatory responsibilities to the consumers of the State of Arkansas, will utilize the contracted actuarial firms for services such as statutory examinations, financial analysis and audits of insurance firms located throughout the United States and falling under AID's jurisdiction.

2.2 MINIMUM QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- A. The vendor **must** be a professional actuarial services firm, preferably with broad expertise in multiple disciplines such as property and casualty, life, and health insurances.
- B. AID will accept responses from qualified actuarial firms specializing in only one or two disciplines. However, the vendor **must** have a system presently in place to subcontract any services for any lines of business and/or disciplines needed in order to provide AID with the required services the firm is unable to provide. The vendor **must** be prepared to provide subcontracting services without causing delay to the engagement at hand.
- C. The vendor **shall** be required to provide actuarial and consulting services on-site at insurance firms under the jurisdiction of AID located throughout the United States.
- D. The vendor **must** have professional experience in Information Technology (IT) audits and examinations of insurance firms located throughout the United States and falling under the jurisdiction of AID.
- E. The vendor **must** have professional experience in analysis and valuation assignments, data extraction, financial analysis and examinations pertaining to the insurance industry, including other analysis and rating reviews as needed by AID.
- D. The vendor **must** be a member of the American Academy of Actuaries and all services conducted by the vendor under this contract **must** be performed or supervised by a member of the American Academy of Actuaries.
- E. The vendor **must** have experience in the NAIC Risk-Focused Surveillance Examination Approach.

2.3 GENERAL SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

- A. AID anticipates approximately 95% of the work performed under the contracts will be for Financial Examination and Analysis Services, and IT Audits and/or Examinations. AID anticipates the remaining 5% of the work performed under the contracts will be for Annual Filings Review and Analysis of Rates/Forms.
- B. The vendor **shall** conduct on-site visits to insurance firms for data collection, financial examinations, financial analysis and IT audits and examinations. Historically, approximately 85-90 percent of the engagements require on-site visits. The duration of the on-site visit will be variable, and dependent on the size and complexity of the insurance firm under examination or analysis.
- C. The vendor **shall** provide actuarial and consulting services to AID via in person attendance, email, or conference call during any analysis, examination, annual statement actuarial filings, or any AID engagement requiring the services outlined in this solicitation, as determined by AID.
- D. The vendor **shall** provide expert testimony, in person, for any court proceedings, depositions, or administrative hearings as required by AID. Typically, these hearings or proceedings are held in Little Rock, Arkansas, and

notice of any such required testimony will be provided to the vendor by AID in advance. Historically, the need for attendance at testimony has been very limited and infrequent.

- E. The vendor **shall** provide actuarial and consulting services via in person attendance, conference call or email communication during the evaluation, assessment, and testing of the IT general control environments, application controls, and cyber security of insurance entities under the jurisdiction of AID and at locations throughout the United States.
- F. The vendor **shall** attend, either in person or via conference call, all examination and analysis meetings held at AID.
- G. The vendor **shall** provide analysis process services for all lines of business.

2.4 **FINANCIAL EXAMINATION ACTUARIAL SERVICES**

- A. The vendor **shall** perform and/or assist AID in performing the financial examinations of insurance firms for all lines of business affecting insurance and reinsurance, as required by AID.
- B. The vendor **shall** provide assistance and support to AID through personal attendance at the financial examinations and **shall** actively participate in the financial examinations at insurance firms under the jurisdiction of AID. If portions of the examination do not require in person attendance, the vendor **shall** also provide support and guidance via conference call or email communication as required by AID.
- C. The AID Chief Examiner or Examiner in Charge of the specific examination shall determine the timing of any on-site visits by the vendor. The Chief Examiner or Examiner in Charge may vary per examination and the AID will disclose the contact information of the Examiner in Charge to the vendor upon execution of the Letter of Engagement. (*See Section 2.9 Letter of Engagement.*)
- D. The vendor **shall** conduct examination work based on criteria prescribed by AID and in accordance with Arkansas Law. In certain instances where the vendor may require criteria other than what is prescribed by AID in order to conduct the examination, approval **must** be obtained from AID, in writing, prior to using the altered criteria.
- E. The vendor **shall** coordinate all examination work performed with AID's Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation, Chief Examiner, and/or Examiner in Charge of the specific examination review. AID will provide the appropriate contact information necessary upon execution of the Letter of Engagement. (*See Letter of Engagement, Section 2.9.*)

2.5 **FINANCIAL ANALYSIS ACTUARIAL SERVICES**

- A. The vendor **shall** perform and/or assist AID in performing the financial analysis of insurance firms for all lines of business affecting insurance and reinsurance, as required by AID.
- B. The vendor **shall** provide assistance and support to AID through active participation in the financial analysis, and by providing in person support on-site at insurance firms under the jurisdiction of AID. If portions of the analysis do not require in person attendance, the vendor **shall** also provide support and guidance via conference call or email communications, as required by AID.
- C. The AID Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation or Manager of Financial Analysis of the specific analysis will determine the timing of any on-site visits by the vendor. The AID contact for analysis may vary per analysis and AID will disclose the appropriate contact to the vendor upon execution of the Letter of Engagement. (*See Letter of Engagement, Section 2.9.*)
- D. The vendor **shall** conduct analysis work based on criteria prescribed by AID and in accordance with Arkansas Law. In certain instances where the vendor may require criteria other than what is prescribed by AID in order to conduct the analysis, approval **must** be obtained from the AID, in writing, prior to using the altered criteria.
- E. The vendor **shall** coordinate all analysis work performed with AID's Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation, Financial Analysis Manager, and/or the Examiner in Charge of the specific analysis review. AID will

provide the appropriate contact information upon execution of the Letter of Engagement. (See *Letter of Engagement, Section 2.9*)

- F. The vendor **shall** perform actuarial analysis of the Worker's Compensation self-insurance program for the State of Arkansas, once per year at a time determined by AID. The analysis **must** include an estimate of the unpaid Workers Compensation losses and allocated loss adjustment expenses with a projection of unpaid claim liabilities.
- G. The vendor **shall** perform a review and analysis of Rates/Forms.
- H. The vendor **shall** review and fully analyze the financial statements submitted by insurers as required by AID.
- I. The vendor may request specific information from AID regarding all matters pertaining to the areas under analysis.

2.6 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AUDITS AND EXAMINATIONS

- A. The vendor **shall** conduct and/or assist AID in conducting IT audit and examination services for all lines of business pertaining to the insurance industry.
- B. The vendor **shall** provide assistance and support to AID through personal attendance at the IT audits and/or examinations and **shall** actively participate in the audits and/or examinations at insurance firms under the jurisdiction of AID. If portions of the audits and/or examinations do not require in person attendance, the vendor **shall** also provide support and guidance via conference call or email communication as required by AID.
- C. The vendor **shall** evaluate, assess, and test the IT general control environment, application controls, and the cybersecurity of insurance entities regulated by AID.
- D. The AID manager in charge of the specific IT audit or examination will determine the timing of any on-site visits by the vendor. The manager in charge of each IT audit or examination may vary per engagement. AID will disclose all necessary contact information to the vendor upon execution of the Letter of Engagement. (See *Letter of Engagement, Section 2.9.*)
- E. The vendor **shall** conduct the IT audits and examinations based on criteria prescribed by AID and in accordance with Arkansas Law. In certain instances where the vendor may require criteria other than what was prescribed by AID in order to conduct the IT audit or examination, approval **must** be obtained from AID, in writing, prior to using the altered criteria.
- F. The vendor **shall** coordinate all IT audits and examinations with AID's Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation, the Financial Analysis Manager, and/or the Chief Examiner in charge of the specific IT audit or examination. AID will provide the contact information upon execution of the Letter of Engagement. See *Letter of Engagement, Section 2.9.*

2.7 ANNUAL FILINGS REVIEW

- A. The State of Arkansas does not perform actuarial reviews on all annual filings. However, the vendor **shall** assist AID in annual filings review, as requested by AID.
- B. Upon request by AID, the vendor **shall** review filings such as annual statements, actuarial opinions, actuarial memorandums, or other filings deemed necessary for review by AID.

2.8 ENGAGEMENT INITIATION

- A. The vendors will be chosen for an engagement as an engagement becomes available and will be chosen based on the following criteria:
 - 1. Any Potential Conflicts of Interest
 - 2. Insurance specialty of the firm and/or staff

- The vendor **must** submit a list of the firm's specialties, the number of staff for each specialty, and amount of experience of the staff in each specialty. (See *Technical Proposal Response Packet "Specialty Listing"*)
3. The availability of staff member(s) who have experience in the particular specialty
 4. The location of the engagement in relation to the location of the vendor
 5. The timing of the engagement in relation to the vendor's schedule
- B. AID will contact the vendor via email or telephone to confirm the vendor's availability for the engagement, and to provide information regarding the engagement such as the size and scope of the engagement, specific criteria required by AID, location, and start date.
 - C. Upon acceptance of the engagement by the contacted vendor, the vendor **shall** provide AID with a Letter of Engagement. The vendor **shall** submit the Letter of Engagement to AID's Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation, or approved designee, for approval. (See *Letter of Engagement, Section 2.9.*)
 - D. Upon receipt of the Letter of Engagement, AID will determine if the billable hours, and/or rate required to complete the engagement is within AID's budget. If the AID and the vendor cannot agree upon the amount of billable hours and/or rate, AID will consider the vendor as non-responsive and will contact the next vendor in line based on the criteria outlined in Section 2.8, Items A-B above.
 - E. In order for AID to maintain budgetary control over its funds, each engagement **must** be negotiated as to an hour and/or cost cap. Fees for each engagement **shall** be determined per engagement and are negotiated per billable hour and/or rate of each billable hour.
 - F. If AID and the vendor negotiate the amount of billable hours and/or rate, and the billable hours and/or rate change from that presented in the original Letter of Engagement, the vendor **shall** provide AID's Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation, or approved designee, with an updated Letter of Engagement for approval that reflects any change resulting from the negotiations.

2.9 LETTER OF ENGAGEMENT

- A. Unless waived by AID, the Letter of Engagement **must** be approved and executed by AID's Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation, or approved designee, prior to the commencement of any AID engagement.
- B. The AID Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation, Manager of Financial Analysis, and/or Chief Examiner of the specific engagement will also sign the Letter of Engagement and return to the vendor with all appropriate contact information.
- C. The Letter of Engagement **must** include the following information:
 - The scope of the engagement based upon criteria prescribed by AID
 - The description of work required for the engagement
 - The number of billable hours required to complete the engagement based on specifications provided by AID
 - The rate for each billable hour
 - The completion date of the engagement
 - The final engagement cost
 - **Any other information as deemed necessary by the AID**

- D. The vendor **shall** only bill the State for working hours up to the limits stated in the Letter of Engagement.
- E. The vendor **shall** notify AID's Deputy Commissioner for Financial Regulation, Manager of Financial Analysis, and/or Chief Examiner with any deviation in billable hours, or of any circumstance that may cause the cost as presented in the Letter of Engagement to change. Any deviations from the Final Engagement Cost as presented in The Letter of Engagement, **must** be approved by AID in writing.

2.10 TRAVEL EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT

- A. AID will reimburse approved travel related expenses incurred by the vendor while performing services outlined in this RFQ.
- B. AID will reimburse the vendor for domestic airfare at a maximum of standard coach rates or actual cost, whichever is less. AID will provide the vendor with airfare reimbursement for any approved engagement when in person attendance is required or requested by AID, such as for hearings, on-site analyses, examinations or reviews, and data collection visits to insurance firms under the jurisdiction of AID.
- C. AID will reimburse the vendor for food and lodging expenses when personal attendance is required or requested by AID, such as for hearings, on-site analysis, examinations or reviews, or data collection visits to insurance firms under the jurisdiction of AID. Food and lodging expenses **shall** only be billable up to the maximum of the Federal allowable rate for such expenses, or actual cost, whichever is less.
- D. The vendor **shall not** bill the State for travel time or overnight time off.
- E. Invoices submitted by the vendor may include line items for billable hours for actuarial service, and travel related expenses.

2.11 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

- A. State law requires that all contracts for services include Performance Standards for measuring the overall quality of services provided. Below, *Table 1 Performance Standards* identifies expected deliverables, performance measures, or outcomes; and defines the acceptable standards a vendor **must** meet in order to avoid assessment of damages.
- B. The State may be open to negotiations of Performance Standards prior to contract award, prior to the commencement of services, or at times throughout the contract duration.
- C. The State **shall** have the right to modify, add, or delete Performance Standards throughout the term of the contract, should the State determine it is in its best interest to do so. Any changes or additions to performance standards will be made in good faith following acceptable industry standards, and may include the input of the vendor so as to establish standards that are reasonably achievable.
- D. All changes made to the Performance Standards **shall** become an official part of the contract.
- E. Performance Standards **shall** continue throughout the term of the contract.
- F. Failure to meet the minimum Performance Standards as specified **shall** result in the assessment of damages.
- G. In the event a Performance Standard is not met, the vendor will have the opportunity to defend or respond to the insufficiency. The State **shall** have the right to waive damages if it determines there were extenuating factors beyond the control of the vendor that hindered the performance of services. In these instances, the State **shall** have final determination of the performance acceptability.
- H. Should any compensation be owed to the agency due to the assessment of damages, vendor **shall** follow the direction of the agency regarding the required compensation process.
- I. Specific timelines, or other Performance Standard criteria, will be negotiated for each engagement, with AID having final determination of such.

SECTION 3 – CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Do not provide responses to items in this section.

3.1 RESPONSE SCORE

- A. OSP will review each *Response Packet* to verify submission Requirements have been met. *Response Packets* that do not meet submission *Requirements* **shall** be disqualified and **shall not** be evaluated.
- B. An agency-appointed Evaluation Committee will evaluate and score qualifying responses. Evaluation will be based on vendor’s response to the *Information for Evaluation* section included in the *Response Packet*. Other agencies, consultants, and experts may also examine documents at the discretion of the Agency.
- C. The *Information for Evaluation* section has been divided into sub-sections.
1. In each sub-section, items/questions have each been assigned a maximum point value of ten (10) points. The total point value for each sub-section is reflected in the table below as the Maximum Raw Score Possible.
 2. The agency has assigned Weighted Percentages to each sub-section according to its significance.

*Sub-Section’s Percentage Weight x Total Weighted Score = Maximum Weighted Score Possible for the sub-section.

- D. The vendor’s weighted score for each sub-section will be determined using the following formula:

$$(A/B)*C = D$$

A = Actual Raw Points received for sub-section in evaluation
 B = Maximum Raw Points possible for sub-section
 C = Maximum Weighted Score possible for sub-section
 D = Weighted Score received for sub-section

- E. Vendor’s weighted scores for sub-sections will be added to determine the Total Score for the Response.
- F. Responses that **do not** receive a minimum weighted score of 300 may not move forward in the solicitation process.

3.2 VENDOR ACCEPTANCE OF EVALUATION TECHNIQUE

- A. Vendor **must** agree to all evaluation processes and procedures as defined in this solicitation.
- B. The submission of a *Response Packet* **shall** signify the vendor’s understanding and agreement that subjective judgments **shall** be made during the evaluation and scoring of the Technical Proposals.

SECTION 4 – GENERAL CONTRACTUAL REQUIREMENTS

- **Do not provide responses to items in this section.**

4.1 PAYMENT AND INVOICE PROVISIONS

F. All invoices **shall** be forwarded to:

- G. Payment will be made in accordance with applicable State of Arkansas accounting procedures upon acceptance of goods and services by the agency.
- H. The State **shall not** be invoiced in advance of delivery and acceptance of any goods or services.
- I. Payment will be made only after the vendor has successfully satisfied the agency as to the reliability and effectiveness of the goods or services purchased as a whole.
- J. The vendor should invoice the agency by an itemized list of charges. The agency's Purchase Order Number and/or the Contract Number should be referenced on each invoice.
- K. Other sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional Requirements for invoicing.
- L. Selected vendor **must** be registered with the State in order to receive payment and future *Bid Solicitation* notifications. Vendors may register on-line at <https://www.ark.org/vendor/index.html>.
- M. Invoicing may include separate line items for billable hours for actuarial service, and travel related expenses.

4.2 GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. The State **shall not** lease any equipment or software for a period of time which continues past the end of a fiscal year unless the contract allows for cancellation by the State Procurement Official upon a 30 day written notice to the vendor/lessor in the event funds are not appropriated.
- B. The State **shall not** contract with another party to indemnify and defend that party for any liability and damages.
- C. The State **shall not** pay damages, legal expenses, or other costs and expenses of any other party.
- D. The State **shall not** continue a contract once any equipment has been repossessed.
- E. Any litigation involving the State **must** take place in Pulaski County, Arkansas.
- F. The State **shall not** agree to any provision of a contract which violates the laws or constitution of the State of Arkansas.
- G. The State **shall not** enter a contract which grants to another party any remedies other than the following:
- The right to possession.
 - The right to accrued payments.
 - The right to expenses of deinstallation.
 - The right to expenses of repair to return the equipment to normal working order, normal wear and tear excluded.
 - The right to recover only amounts due at the time of repossession and any unamortized nonrecurring cost as allowed by Arkansas Law.

- H. The laws of the State of Arkansas **shall** govern this contract.
- I. A contract **shall not** be effective prior to award being made by a State Procurement Official.
- J. In a contract with another party, the State will accept the risk of loss of the equipment or software and pay for any destruction, loss or damage of the equipment or software while the State has such risk, when:
 - The extent of liability for such risk is based upon the purchase price of the equipment or software at the time of any loss, and
 - The contract has required the State to carry insurance for such risk.

4.3 **CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT**

- A. The vendor **shall** at all times observe and comply with federal and State of Arkansas laws, local laws, ordinances, orders, and regulations existing at the time of, or enacted subsequent to the execution of a resulting contract which in any manner affect the completion of the work.
- B. The vendor **shall** indemnify and save harmless the agency and all its officers, representatives, agents, and employees against any claim or liability arising from or based upon the violation of any such law, ordinance, regulation, order or decree by an employee, representative, or subcontractor of the vendor.

4.4 **STATEMENT OF LIABILITY**

- A. The State will demonstrate reasonable care but will not be liable in the event of loss, destruction or theft of vendor-owned equipment or software and technical and business or operations literature to be delivered or to be used in the installation of deliverables and services. The vendor **shall** retain total liability for equipment, software and technical and business or operations literature. The State **shall** not at any time be responsible for or accept liability for any vendor-owned items.
- B. The vendor's liability for damages to the State **shall** be limited to the value of the Contract or \$5,000,000, whichever is higher. The foregoing limitation of liability **shall not** apply to claims for infringement of United States patent, copyright, trademarks or trade secrets; to claims for personal injury or damage to property caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the vendor; to claims covered by other specific provisions of the Contract calling for damages; or to court costs or attorney's fees awarded by a court in addition to damages after litigation based on the Contract. The vendor and the State **shall not** be liable to each other, regardless of the form of action, for consequential, incidental, indirect, or special damages. This limitation of liability **shall not** apply to claims for infringement of United States patent, copyright, trademark or trade secrets; to claims for personal injury or damage to property caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the vendor; to claims covered by other specific provisions of the Contract calling for damages; or to court costs or attorney's fees awarded by a court in addition to damages after litigation based on the Contract.
- C. Language in these terms and conditions **shall not** be construed or deemed as the State's waiver of its right of sovereign immunity. The vendor agrees that any claims against the State, whether sounding in tort or in contract, **shall** be brought before the Arkansas Claims Commission as provided by Arkansas law, and **shall** be governed accordingly.

4.5 **RECORD RETENTION**

- A. The vendor **shall** maintain all pertinent financial and accounting records and evidence pertaining to the contract in accordance with generally accepted principles of accounting and as specified by the State of Arkansas Law. Upon request, access **shall** be granted to State or Federal Government entities or any of their duly authorized representatives.
- B. Financial and accounting records **shall** be made available, upon request, to the State of Arkansas's designee(s) at any time during the contract period and any extension thereof, and for five (5) years from expiration date and final payment on the contract or extension thereof.
- C. Other sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional Requirements regarding record retention.

4.6 CONFIDENTIALITY

- A. The vendor, vendor's subsidiaries, and vendor's employees **shall** be bound to all laws and to all Requirements set forth in this *Bid Solicitation* concerning the confidentiality and secure handling of information of which they may become aware during the course of providing services under a resulting contract.
- B. Consistent and/or uncorrected breaches of confidentiality may constitute grounds for cancellation of a resulting contract, and the State **shall** have the right to cancel the contract on these grounds.
- C. Previous sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional confidentiality Requirements.

4.7 CONTRACT INTERPRETATION

Should the State and vendor interpret specifications differently, either party may request clarification. However if an agreement cannot be reached, the determination of the State **shall** be final and controlling.

4.8 CANCELLATION

- A. In the event the State no longer needs the service or commodity specified in the contract or purchase order due to program changes, changes in laws, rules, or regulations, relocation of offices, or lack of appropriated funding. The State **shall** give the vendor written notice of cancellation, specifying the terms and the effective date of contract termination. The effective date of termination **shall** be 30 days from the date of notification, unless a longer timeframe is specified in the notification.
- B. Upon default of a vendor, the State **shall** agree to pay only sums due for goods and services received and accepted up to cancellation of the contract.

4.9 SEVERABILITY

If any provision of the contract, including items incorporated by reference, is declared or found to be illegal, unenforceable, or void, then both the agency and the vendor **shall** be relieved of all obligations arising under such provision. If the remainder of the contract is capable of performance, it **shall not** be affected by such declaration or finding and **shall** be fully performed.

SECTION 5 – STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- **Do not provide responses to items in this section.**
- 1. **GENERAL:** Any special terms and conditions included in this solicitation **shall** override these Standard Terms and Conditions. The Standard Terms and Conditions and any special terms and conditions **shall** become part of any contract entered into if any or all parts of the bid are accepted by the State of Arkansas.
- 2. **ACCEPTANCE AND REJECTION:** The State **shall** have the right to accept or reject all or any part of a bid or any and all bids, to waive minor technicalities, and to award the bid to best serve the interest of the State.
- 3. **BID SUBMISSION:** Original Response Packets **must** be submitted to the Office of State Procurement on or before the date and time specified for bid opening. The Response Packet **must** contain all documents, information, and attachments as specifically and expressly required in the *Bid Solicitation*. The bid **must** be typed or printed in ink. The signature **must** be in ink. Unsigned bids **shall** be disqualified. The person signing the bid should show title or authority to bind his firm in a contract. Multiple responses **must** be placed in separate packages and should be completely and properly identified. Late bids **shall not** be considered under any circumstances.
- 4. **PRICES:** Bid unit price F.O.B. destination. In case of errors in extension, unit prices **shall** govern. Prices **shall** be firm and **shall not** be subject to escalation unless otherwise specified in the *Bid Solicitation*. Unless otherwise specified, the bid **must** be firm for acceptance for thirty days from the bid opening date. "Discount from list" bids are not acceptable unless requested in the *Bid Solicitation*.
- 5. **QUANTITIES:** Quantities stated in a *Bid Solicitation* for term contracts are estimates only, and are not guaranteed. Vendor **must** bid unit price on the estimated quantity and unit of measure specified. The State may order more or less than the estimated quantity on term contracts. Quantities stated on firm contracts are actual Requirements of the ordering agency.
- 6. **BRAND NAME REFERENCES:** Unless otherwise specified in the *Bid Solicitation*, any catalog brand name or manufacturer reference used in the *Bid Solicitation* is descriptive only, not restrictive, and used to indicate the type and quality desired. Bids on brands of like nature and quality will be considered. If bidding on other than referenced specifications, the bid **must** show the manufacturer, brand or trade name, and other descriptions, and should include the manufacturer's illustrations and complete descriptions of the product offered. The State **shall** have the right to determine whether a substitute offered is equivalent to and meets the standards of the item specified, and the State may require the vendor to supply additional descriptive material. The vendor **shall** guarantee that the product offered will meet or exceed specifications identified in this *Bid Solicitation*. Vendors not bidding an alternate to the referenced brand name or manufacturer **shall** be required to furnish the product according to brand names, numbers, etc., as specified in the solicitation.
- 7. **GUARANTY:** All items bid **shall** be newly manufactured, in first-class condition, latest model and design, including, where applicable, containers suitable for shipment and storage, unless otherwise indicated in the *Bid Solicitation*. The vendor hereby guarantees that everything furnished hereunder **shall** be free from defects in design, workmanship and material, that if sold by drawing, sample or specification, it **shall** conform thereto and **shall** serve the function for which it was furnished. The vendor **shall** further guarantee that if the items furnished hereunder are to be installed by the vendor, such items **shall** function properly when installed. The vendor **shall** guarantee that all applicable laws have been complied with relating to construction, packaging, labeling and registration. The vendor's obligations under this paragraph **shall** survive for a period of one year from the date of delivery, unless otherwise specified herein.
- 8. **SAMPLES:** Samples or demonstrators, when requested, **must** be furnished free of expense to the State. Each sample should be marked with the vendor's name and address, bid or contract number and item number. If requested, samples that are not destroyed during reasonable examination will be returned at vendor's expense. After reasonable examination, all demonstrators will be returned at vendor's expense.
- 9. **TESTING PROCEDURES FOR SPECIFICATIONS COMPLIANCE:** Tests may be performed on samples or demonstrators submitted with the bid or on samples taken from the regular shipment. In the event products tested fail to meet or exceed all conditions and Requirements of the specifications, the cost of the sample used and the reasonable cost of the testing **shall** be borne by the vendor.
- 10. **AMENDMENTS:** Vendor's responses cannot be altered or amended after the bid opening except as permitted by regulation.
- 11. **TAXES AND TRADE DISCOUNTS:** Do not include State or local sales taxes in the bid price. Trade discounts should be deducted from the unit price and the net price should be shown in the bid.
- 12. **AWARD:** Term Contract: A contract award will be issued to the successful vendor. It results in a binding obligation without further action by either party. This award does not authorize shipment. Shipment is authorized by the receipt of a purchase order from the ordering agency. Firm Contract: A written State purchase order authorizing shipment will be furnished to the successful vendor.
- 13. **DELIVERY ON FIRM CONTRACTS:** This solicitation shows the number of days to place a commodity in the ordering agency's designated location under normal conditions. If the vendor cannot meet the stated delivery, alternate delivery schedules may become a factor in an award. The Office of State Procurement **shall** have the right to extend delivery if reasons appear valid. If the date is not acceptable, the agency may buy elsewhere and any additional cost **shall** be borne by the vendor.

- 14. DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS:** No substitutions or cancellations are permitted without written approval of the Office of State Procurement. Delivery **shall** be made during agency work hours only 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Central Time, unless prior approval for other delivery has been obtained from the agency. Packing memoranda **shall** be enclosed with each shipment.
- 15. STORAGE:** The ordering agency is responsible for storage if the contractor delivers within the time required and the agency cannot accept delivery.
- 16. DEFAULT:** All commodities furnished **shall** be subject to inspection and acceptance of the ordering agency after delivery. Back orders, default in promised delivery, or failure to meet specifications **shall** authorize the Office of State Procurement to cancel this contract or any portion of it and reasonably purchase commodities elsewhere and charge full increase, if any, in cost and handling to the defaulting contractor. The contractor **must** give written notice to the Office of State Procurement and ordering agency of the reason and the expected delivery date. Consistent failure to meet delivery without a valid reason may cause removal from the vendors list or suspension of eligibility for award.
- 17. VARIATION IN QUANTITY:** The State assumes no liability for commodities produced, processed or shipped in excess of the amount specified on the agency's purchase order.
- 18. INVOICING:** The contractor **shall** be paid upon the completion of all of the following: (1) submission of an original and the specified number of copies of a properly itemized invoice showing the bid and purchase order numbers, where itemized in the *Bid Solicitation*, (2) delivery and acceptance of the commodities and (3) proper and legal processing of the invoice by all necessary State agencies. Invoices **must** be sent to the "Invoice To" point shown on the purchase order.
- 19. STATE PROPERTY:** Any specifications, drawings, technical information, dies, cuts, negatives, positives, data or any other commodity furnished to the contractor hereunder or in contemplation hereof or developed by the contractor for use hereunder **shall** remain property of the State, **shall** be kept confidential, **shall** be used only as expressly authorized, and **shall** be returned at the contractor's expense to the F.O.B. point provided by the agency or by OSP. Vendor **shall** properly identify items being returned.
- 20. PATENTS OR COPYRIGHTS:** The contractor **must** agree to indemnify and hold the State harmless from all claims, damages and costs including attorneys' fees, arising from infringement of patents or copyrights.
- 21. ASSIGNMENT:** Any contract entered into pursuant to this solicitation **shall not** be assignable nor the duties thereunder delegable by either party without the written consent of the other party of the contract.
- 22. CLAIMS:** Any claims the Contractor may assert under this Agreement shall be brought before the Arkansas State Claims Commission ("Commission"), which shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any and all claims that the Contractor may have arising from or in connection with this Agreement. Unless the Contractor's obligations to perform are terminated by the State, the Contractor shall continue to provide the Services under this Agreement even in the event that the Contractor has a claim pending before the Commission.
- 23. CANCELLATION:** In the event, the State no longer needs the commodities or services specified for any reason, (e.g., program changes; changes in laws, rules or regulations; relocation of offices; lack of appropriated funding, etc.), the State **shall** have the right to cancel the contract or purchase order by giving the vendor written notice of such cancellation thirty (30) days prior to the date of cancellation.
- Any delivered but unpaid for goods will be returned in normal condition to the contractor by the State. If the State is unable to return the commodities in normal condition and there are no funds legally available to pay for the goods, the contractor may file a claim with the Arkansas Claims Commission under the laws and regulations governing the filing of such claims. If upon cancellation the contractor has provided services which the State has accepted, the contractor may file a claim. **NOTHING IN THIS CONTRACT SHALL BE DEEMED A WAIVER OF THE STATE'S RIGHT TO SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.**
- 24. DISCRIMINATION:** In order to comply with the provision of Act 954 of 1977, relating to unfair employment practices, the vendor agrees that: (a) the vendor **shall not** discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, sex, color, age, religion, handicap, or national origin; (b) in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the vendor **shall** state that all qualified applicants **shall** receive consideration without regard to race, color, sex, age, religion, handicap, or national origin; (c) the vendor will furnish such relevant information and reports as requested by the Human Resources Commission for the purpose of determining compliance with the statute; (d) failure of the vendor to comply with the statute, the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder and this nondiscrimination clause **shall** be deemed a breach of contract and it may be cancelled, terminated or suspended in whole or in part; (e) the vendor **shall** include the provisions of above items (a) through (d) in every subcontract so that such provisions **shall** be binding upon such subcontractor or vendor.
- 25. CONTINGENT FEE:** The vendor guarantees that he has not retained a person to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies maintained by the vendor for the purpose of securing business.
- 26. ANTITRUST ASSIGNMENT:** As part of the consideration for entering into any contract pursuant to this solicitation, the vendor named on the *Response Signature Page* for this solicitation, acting herein by the authorized individual or its duly authorized agent, hereby assigns, sells and transfers to the State of Arkansas all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action it may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or this State for price fixing, which causes of action have accrued prior to the date of this assignment and which relate solely to the particular goods or services purchased or produced by this State pursuant to this contract.
- 27. DISCLOSURE:** Failure to make any disclosure required by Governor's Executive Order 98-04, or any violation of any rule, regulation, or policy adopted pursuant to that order, **shall** be a material breach of the terms of this contract. Any contractor,

whether an individual or entity, who fails to make the required disclosure or who violates any rule, regulation, or policy **shall** be subject to all legal remedies available to the agency.
