SECTION 1 - GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION

- **Do not provide responses to items in this section unless specifically and expressly required.**

1.1 PURPOSE

This Invitation for Bid (IFB) is issued by the Office of State Procurement (OSP) for the Arkansas Department of Parks and Tourism (ADPT) to obtain pricing and a term contract for janitorial service at War Memorial Stadium, 1 Stadium Drive, Little Rock AR 72225.

1.2 TYPE OF CONTRACT

- A. As a result of this IFB, OSP intends to award a contract to a single Contractor.
- B. The anticipated starting date for any resulting contract is July 1, 2018, except that the actual contract start date may be adjusted forward unilaterally by the State for up to three calendar months. By submitting a signed bid in response to the IFB, the Prospective Contractor represents and warrants that it will honor its bid as being held open as irrevocable for this period.
- C. The initial term of a resulting contract will be for one (1) year. Upon mutual agreement by the Contractor and agency, the contract may be renewed by OSP for up to six (6) additional one-year terms or portions thereof, not to exceed a total aggregate contract term of seven (7) consecutive years.

1.3 ISSUING AGENCY

OSP, as the issuing office, is the sole point of contact throughout this solicitation.

1.4 BID OPENING LOCATION

1.5 ACCEPTANCE OF REQUIREMENTS

- A. A Prospective Contractor **must** unconditionally accept all Requirements in the Requirements Section(s) of this IFB to be considered a responsive Prospective Contractor.
- B. A Prospective Contractor's bid will be disqualified if a Prospective Contractor takes exceptions to any Requirements in the Requirements Section(s) of this IFB.

1.6 DEFINITION OF TERMS

- A. The State Procurement Official has made every effort to use industry-accepted terminology in this *Bid Solicitation* and will attempt to further clarify any point of an item in question as indicated in *Clarification of Bid Solicitation*.
- B. Unless otherwise defined herein, all terms defined in Arkansas Procurement Law and used herein have the same definitions herein as specified therein.
- C. "Prospective Contractor" means a person who submits a bid in response to this solicitation.
- D. "Contractor" means a person who sells or contracts to sell commodities and/or services.
- E. The terms "Invitation For Bid", "IFB," "Bid Solicitation," and "Solicitation" are used synonymously in this document.
- F. "Responsive bid" means a bid submitted in response to this solicitation that conforms in all material respects to this IFB.

- G. "Bid Submission Requirement" means a task a Prospective Contractor completes when submitting a bid response. These requirements will be distinguished by using the term "**shall**" or "**must**" in the requirement.
- H. "Requirement" means a specification that a Contractor's product and/or service **must** perform during the term of the contract. These specifications will be distinguished by using the term "shall" or "must" in the requirement.
- I. "State" means the State of Arkansas. When the term "State" is used herein to reference any obligation of the State under a contract that results from this solicitation, that obligation is limited to the State agency using such a contract.

1.7 **RESPONSE DOCUMENTS**

A. *Bid Response Packet*

1. The following are Bid Submission Requirements and **must** be submitted in the original Bid Response Packet.
 - a. Original signed *Bid Signature Page*. (See *Bid Response Packet*.)
 - i. An official authorized to bind the Prospective Contractor(s) to a resultant contract **must** sign the Bid Signature Page included in the *Bid Response Packet*.
 - ii. Prospective Contractor's signature signifies agreement to and compliance with all Requirements in this IFB, and that any exception that conflicts with a Requirement or Bid Submission Requirement of this *Bid Solicitation* will cause the Prospective Contractor's bid to be disqualified.
 - iii. Bid response **must** be in the English language.
 - b. One (1) original hard copy of the *Official Bid Price Sheet*. Pricing **must** be proposed in U.S. dollars and cents.
2. The following items should be submitted in the original Bid Response Packet.
 - a. One (1) electronic copy of the *Official Bid Price Sheet*, preferably on a flash drive. A CD will also be acceptable.
 - b. EO 98-04 Disclosure Form. (See *Standard Terms and Conditions*, #27. *Disclosure*.)
 - c. Copy of Prospective Contractor's *Equal Opportunity Policy*. (See *Equal Opportunity Policy*.)
 - d. Proposed Subcontractors Form. (See Subcontractors.)
3. **DO NOT** include any other documents or ancillary information, such as a cover letter or promotional/marketing information.

1.8 **CLARIFICATION OF BID SOLICITATION**

- A. The Prospective Contractor should notify the OSP buyer of any term, condition, etc., that precludes the Prospective Contractor from submitting a compliant, responsive proposal. Prospective Contractors should note that it is the responsibility of the Prospective Contractor to seek resolution of all such issues, including those relating to the terms and conditions of the contract, prior to the submission of a bid.
- B. Prospective Contractors may contact the OSP buyer with non-substantive questions at any time prior to the bid opening.
- C. An oral statement by OSP will not be part of any contract resulting from this solicitation and may not reasonably be relied on by any Prospective Contractor as an aid to interpretation unless it is reduced to writing and expressly adopted by OSP.

- D. Prospective Contractors entering into a contract with the State **shall** comply with all the terms and conditions contained herein.

1.9 **SUBCONTRACTORS**

- A. Prospective Contractor should complete, sign and submit the *Proposed Subcontractors Form* included in the *Bid Response Packet*.
- B. **Do not** attach any additional information to the *Proposed Subcontractors Form*.
- C. The utilization of any proposed subcontractor is subject to approval by the State agency.

1.10 **PRICING**

- A. Prospective Contractor(s) **shall** include all pricing on the Official Bid Price Sheet(s) only. If any cost is not identified by the successful Contractor but is subsequently incurred in order to achieve successful operation, the Contractor **shall** bear this additional cost. The *Official Bid Price Sheet* is provided as a separate electronic file posted with this *Bid Solicitation*.
- B. To allow time to review bids, prices **must** be valid for **90** days following the bid opening.
- C. DO NOT submit any ancillary information not related to actual pricing on or with the Bid Price Sheet.

1.11 **PRIME CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY**

- A. A single Prospective Contractor **must** be identified as the prime Contractor.
- B. The prime Contractor **shall** be responsible for the contract and jointly and severally liable with any of its subcontractors, affiliates, or agents to the State for the performance thereof.

1.12 **INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION**

- A. By submission of this bid, the Prospective Contractor certifies, and in the case of a joint response, each party thereto certifies as to its own organization, that in connection with this bid:
- The prices in the bid have been arrived at independently, without collusion.
 - No prior information concerning these prices has been received from, or given to, a competitive company.
- B. Evidence of collusion warrants consideration of this bid by the Office of the Attorney General. All Prospective Contractors **shall** understand that this paragraph may be used as a basis for litigation.

1.13 **PROPRIETARY INFORMATION**

- A. Submission documents pertaining to this *Bid Solicitation* become the property of the State and are subject to the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).
- B. In accordance with FOIA and to promote maximum competition in the State competitive bidding process, the State may maintain the confidentiality of certain types of information described in FOIA. Such information may include trade secrets defined by FOIA and other information exempted from the Public Records Act pursuant to FOIA.
- C. Prospective Contractor may designate appropriate portions of its response as confidential, consistent with and to the extent permitted under the Statutes and Rules set forth above, by submitting a redacted copy of the response.
- D. By so redacting any information contained in the response, the Prospective Contractor warrants that it has formed a good faith opinion having received such necessary or proper review by counsel and other knowledgeable advisors that the portions redacted meet the requirements of the Rules and Statutes set forth above.
- E. Under no circumstances will pricing information be designated as confidential.

- F. One (1) complete copy of the submission documents from which any proprietary information has been redacted should be submitted on a flash drive in the *Bid Response Packet*. A CD is also acceptable. Do not submit documents via email or fax.
- G. Except for the redacted information, the redacted copy **must** be identical to the original hard copy, reflecting the same pagination as the original and showing the space from which information was redacted.
- H. The Prospective Contractor is responsible for identifying all proprietary information and for ensuring the electronic copy is protected against restoration of redacted data.
- I. The redacted copy will be open to public inspection under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) without further notice to the Prospective Contractor.
- J. If a redacted copy of the submission documents is not provided with Prospective Contractor's *Bid Response Packet*, a copy of the non-redacted documents, with the exception of financial data (other than pricing), will be released in response to any request made under the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).
- K. If the State deems redacted information to be subject to FOIA, the Prospective Contractor will be contacted prior to release of the documents.
- L. The State has no liability to a Prospective Contractor with respect to the disclosure of Prospective Contractor's confidential information ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction pursuant to FOIA or other applicable law.

1.14 **CAUTION TO PROSPECTIVE CONTRACTORS**

- A. Prior to any contract award, address all communication concerning this *Bid Solicitation* through the OSP buyer.
- B. Do not alter any language in any solicitation document provided by the State.
- C. Do not alter the Official Bid Price Sheet.
- D. All official documents and correspondence related to this solicitation become part of the resultant contract.
- E. The State has the right to award or not award a contract, if it is in the best interest of the State to do so.
- F. As requested, provide clarification regarding Prospective Contractor's bid response to OSP.
- G. Qualifications and proposed services **must** meet or exceed the required specifications as set forth in this *Bid Solicitation*.
- H. Prospective Contractors may submit multiple bids.

1.15 **REQUIREMENT OF ADDENDUM**

- A. Only an addendum written and authorized by OSP will modify this *Bid Solicitation*.
- B. An addendum posted within three (3) calendar days prior to the bid opening may extend the bid opening and may or may not include changes to the Bid Solicitation.
- C. The Prospective Contractor is expected to check the OSP website, <http://www.arkansas.gov/dfa/procurement/bids/index.php>, for any and all addenda up to bid opening.

1.16 **AWARD PROCESS**

- A. Successful Contractor Selection
 - 1. Award will be made to the lowest-bidding, responsible Prospective Contractor on a/an **ALL OR NONE** basis.

B. Negotiations

1. If the State so chooses, negotiations may be conducted with the lowest-bidding Prospective Contractor. Negotiations are conducted at the sole discretion of the State.
2. If negotiations fail to result in a contract, the State may begin the negotiation process with the next lowest-bidding Prospective Contractor. The negotiation process may be repeated until the anticipated successful Contractor has been determined, or until such time the State decides not to move forward with an award.

C. Anticipation to Award

1. Once the anticipated successful Contractor has been determined, the anticipated award will be posted on the OSP website at http://www.arkansas.gov/dfa/procurement/pro_intent.php.
2. The anticipated award will be posted for a period of fourteen (14) days prior to the issuance of a contract. Prospective Contractors and agencies are cautioned that these are preliminary results only, and a contract will not be issued prior to the end of the fourteen day posting period.
3. OSP may waive the policy of Anticipation to Award when it is in the best interest of the State.
4. It is the Prospective Contractor's responsibility to check the OSP website for the posting of an anticipated award.

D. Issuance of Contract

1. Any resultant contract of this *Bid Solicitation* is subject to State approval processes which may include Legislative review.
2. A State Procurement Official will be responsible for the solicitation and award of any resulting contract.

1.17 MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS POLICY

A. A minority-owned business is defined by Arkansas Code Annotated § 15-4-303 as a business owned by a lawful permanent resident of this State who is:

- African American
- American Indian
- Asian American
- Hispanic American
- Pacific Islander American
- A Service Disabled Veteran as designated by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs

B. A women-owned business is defined by Act 1080 of the 91st General Assembly Regular Session 2017 as a business that is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned by one (1) or more women who are lawful permanent residents of this State.

C. The Arkansas Economic Development Commission conducts a certification process for minority-owned and women-owned businesses. If certified, the Prospective Contractor's Certification Number should be included on the *Bid Signature Page*.

1.18 EQUAL OPPORTUNITY POLICY

A. In compliance with Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-104, OSP is required to have a copy of the anticipated Contractor's *Equal Opportunity (EO) Policy* prior to issuing a contract award.

B. *EO Policies* may be submitted in electronic format to the following email address: eeopolicy.osp@dfa.arkansas.gov, but should also be included as a hardcopy accompanying the solicitation response.

- C. The submission of an *EO Policy* to OSP is a one-time Requirement. Contractors are responsible for providing updates or changes to their respective policies, and for supplying *EO Policies* upon request to other State agencies that must also comply with this statute.
- D. Prospective Contractors who are not required by law by to have an *EO Policy* **must** submit a written statement to that effect.

1.19 PROHIBITION OF EMPLOYMENT OF ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS

- A. Pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-105, Contractor(s) providing services **shall** certify with OSP that they do not employ or contract with illegal immigrants.
- B. By signing and submitting a response to this *Bid Solicitation*, a Prospective Contractor agrees and certifies that they do not employ or contract with illegal immigrants. If selected, the Prospective Contractor certifies that they will not employ or contract with illegal immigrants during the aggregate term of a contract.

1.20 RESTRICTION OF BOYCOTT OF ISRAEL

- A. Pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 25-1-503, a public entity **shall not** enter into a contract with a company unless the contract includes a written certification that the person or company is not currently engaged in, and agrees for the duration of the contract not to engage in, a boycott of Israel.
- B. This prohibition does not apply to a company which offers to provide the goods or services for at least twenty percent (20%) less than the lowest certifying business.
- C. By checking the designated box on the Bid Signature Page of the response packet, a Prospective Contractor agrees and certifies that they do not, and will not for the duration of the contract, boycott Israel.

1.21 PAST PERFORMANCE

In accordance with provisions of State Procurement Law, specifically OSP Rule R5:19-11-230(b)(1), a Prospective Contractor's past performance with the State may be used to determine if the Prospective Contractor is "responsible". Bids submitted by Prospective Contractors determined to be non-responsible will be disqualified.

1.22 VISA ACCEPTANCE

- A. Awarded Contractor should have the capability of accepting the State's authorized VISA Procurement Card (p-card) as a method of payment.
- B. Price changes or additional fee(s) **must not** be levied against the State when accepting the p-card as a form of payment.
- C. VISA is not the exclusive method of payment.

1.23 PUBLICITY

- A. Do not discuss the solicitation nor your bid response, nor issue statements or comments, nor provide interviews to any public media during the solicitation and award process.
- B. Failure to comply with this Requirement may be cause for a Prospective Contractor's bid to be disqualified.

1.24 RESERVATION

The State will not pay costs incurred in the preparation of a bid.

SECTION 2 – REQUIREMENTS

- **Do not provide responses to items in this section unless specifically and expressly required.**

2.1 INTRODUCTION

This Invitation for Bid (IFB) is issued by the Office of State Procurement (OSP) for the Arkansas Department of Parks and Tourism (ADPT) to obtain pricing and a term contract for janitorial service at War Memorial Stadium, 1 Stadium Drive, Little Rock AR 72225.

The purpose is to hire janitorial service to ensure all identified facilities are clean before each event is held at War Memorial Stadium. Events will vary and different parts of the stadium will be utilized for specific events. Events are held nights, weekends, holidays, and may be scheduled immediately following the day after an event. The stadium management will immediately notify the Prospective Contractor when an event is booked and the schedule is provided.

The Prospective Contractor **will not** be responsible for trash in the stands, on the concourse, on the field, or in the parking lots.

2.2 SITE VISITATION: MANDATORY

The agency will have one mandatory walk-through for all Prospective Contractors interested in bidding. No more than two (2) representatives from each vendor **shall** be allowed to attend the walk-through.

A sign in sheet **must** be signed upon arrival.

Late arrivals will not be permitted to join the tour.

Attached is a Site Visit Form (Attachment “D”) which **must** be signed by the stadium contact personnel after the completion of the site visit. The site inspection form should be submitted, with the Prospective Contractor’s bid response, to be considered for the job.

NOTE: Failure to attend the walk-through, on the scheduled date and time, will result in a rejection of the Prospective Contractor’s bid response.

2.3 STADIUM EVENTS

Events hosted at the stadium include; Concerts, Razorback Game, Salt Bowl, High School Football and Soccer Games, Championship Games, Band Competitions, Minor League Soccer Games, Corporate Events, Racing, Trade Shows, Teleconferences, Club Meetings and Birthday Parties. Attendance varies depending on the level of the event. All events are scheduled once a promoter/individual books the date with the stadium events coordinator.

Level 1: Special Events

Estimated Quantity: Seventy-five (75) events per year

Attendance: 2,500 or less

Facilities available to rent:

- Press Box, Floor 1, six (6) boxes
- Press Box, Floor 2, six (6) boxes
- Letterman’s Club
- Recruit Room
- Locker Room

***All rental facilities have a cleaning deadline of no later than 5:00 PM the next day.**

Level 2: Large Special Events Using the Field

Estimated Quantity: Fifty (50) events per year

Attendance: 2,500 or Less

Facilities available to rent:

- Concourse Restrooms, four (4)
- Concession Stands, two (2) or less
- Locker rooms, two (2)
- Official Locker Room, one (1)
- Kitchen, one (1)
- Ticket Office

***All rental facilities have a cleaning deadline of no later than 5:00 PM the next day.**

Level 3: DII College Games, Large Special Events, High School Games

Estimated Quantities: Fifty (50) events per year

Attendance: 2,500 to 15,000

Facilities available to rent:

- Concourse Restrooms, five (5) or less
- Concession Stands, three (3) or less
- Locker rooms, two (2)
- Official Locker Room
- Press Box 1 Floors, two (2) restrooms, six (6) boxes
- Kitchen, one (1)
- Ticket Office

***All rental facilities have a cleaning deadline of no later than 5:00 PM the next day.**

Level 4: DII College Game, High School Championships and Concerts

Estimated Quantities: Ten (10) events per year

Attendance: 15,000 to 30,000

Facilities available to rent:

- Concourse Restrooms, ten (10)
- Concession Stands, eight (8) or Less
- Locker rooms, two (2)
- Official Locker Room, one (1)
- Press Box 3 Floor, six (6) restrooms, three (3) concession stands, twelve (12) suites/boxes
- Kitchens, two (2)
- Letterman's Club/Recruit Room, two (2) bar areas six (6) restrooms
- Cheerleader Room
- Ticket Office

***All rental facilities have a cleaning deadline of no later than two (2) business days later by 5:00 PM.**

Level 5: D1 College Games, Salt Bowl and Concerts

Estimated Quantities: Ten (10) events per year

Attendance: 30,000 to 55,000

Facilities available to rent:

- Concourse Restrooms eighteen (18)
- Concession Stands, three (3)
- Locker rooms, two (2)
- Official Locker Room, one (1)
- Press Box 3 floor; six (6) restrooms, three (3) concession stands, twelve (12) suites/boxes
- Kitchens, two (2)
- Letterman's Club / Recruit Room, two (2) bar areas, six (6) restrooms
- Cheerleader Room
- Ticket Office

***All rental facilities have a cleaning deadline of no later than two (2) business days later by 5:00 PM.**

Level 6: Stadium Power Wash

Estimated Quantities: four (4) per year

Facilities and areas:

- Entire Concourse
- All gate entries
- All bleachers
- All ramps and entries into the stands
- Stairways into the stands
- Restrooms
- Concession Stand

***Stadium power wash must be completed during the off season (by April 1) and prior to a Level 5 event.**

Note: The stadium will provide the water and the Contractor **shall** provide all equipment, labor and chemicals. Commercial grade, heat and chemical induced power washing will be required only on the walking surface, excluding the walls, columns, and railings.

2.4 **PROSPECTIVE CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES**

A. **BUSINESS LICENSE**

1. The Prospective Contractor must have a valid Arkansas business license. A copy of the license should be submitted prior to anticipation to award, or when requested by OSP.
2. The Contractor **shall** maintain a valid Arkansas business license (Per City or County) throughout the term of the contract. If a Contractor's business license expires or becomes invalid, the Contractor will have fifteen (15) business days to obtain a new or renewed license. Should a business license require more than fifteen (15) days, justification **must** be submitted by the City or County in which the Contractor is licensed. If justification is not submitted from the City or County, ADPT may submit a thirty (30) day cancellation notice to the Contractor.
3. The Contractor **shall** be responsible for any cost associated with an invalid or delinquent license.
4. The business license name **must** be as shown on the bid response or awarded contract. Failure to provide a current Arkansas business license, as specified above, will result in a VPR for "non-performance" and will constitute grounds for contract cancellation upon thirty (30) day notice of cancellation to the Contractor.

B. **REFERENCES**

Bidders **shall** submit the following references to OSP, when requested, prior to anticipation to award:

1. The Prospective Contractor should submit at least three (3) reference accounts, all of which **must** be in Arkansas, to whom the Prospective Contractor has been providing client services of a same or similar nature (e.g.; nights, weekends, holidays schedule, large facility janitorial services) within the last two (2) years. (See map defining Central Arkansas area – Identified as ADEM Emergency Management Areas – Attachment "B"). Submitted reference accounts should be on reference accounts company letterhead.
2. Each reference should include contact person, telephone numbers including cell phone number if possible, and email address.
3. The Office of State Procurement (OSP) reserves the right to contact any or all clients of the bidder even if they were not provided by the Prospective Contractor. Sites may be visited by OSP and/or the ADPT Representative at any time.
4. The Prospective Contractor **must** have cleaned commercial general office space with a minimum of **50,000 square feet** or more, for a consecutive twelve (12) month period, within the last year. Combining square footage for multiple buildings does not meet this requirement.
5. The reference accounts should rate the quality of cleaning by rating the bidder's performance as to **poor, fair, good or excellent** in quality of cleaning.

C. CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS

1. Prior to awarding, the Prospective Contractor **shall** provide, at no cost to the State of Arkansas, the following Criminal Background Check Reports (Background Reports – Attachment “C”) on:
 - a. Prospective Contractor and company official.
 - b. Supervisors and Employees.
2. Online background reports **will not** be accepted. Arkansas State Police (ASP) certified background reports on all employees **shall be provided to ADPT** prior to placement in the stadium, including employees that may be added later or those employees that are used for infrequent tasks such as the stadium power wash cleaning requirement.
 - a. Background reports **must** be current. Current is defined as background reports which are dated and received by ADPT within (72) hours of being sent by the Arkansas State Police (ASP). Background reports which are not current **will not** be considered.
 - b. OSP and ADPT reserve the right to terminate any resultant contract resulting from this IFB should evidence show tampering with any of the Background Reports.
 - c. The Prospective Contractor **shall** utilize the ASP for all Background Reports.
 - d. The Prospective Contractor **shall** immediately notify ADPT of any changes or substitution of any employees assigned to the stadium. Background Reports **must** be sent by ASP directly to ADPT for review.
 - e. All employees working in the stadium must pass an ASP criminal background check prior to the commencement of their work. No employee **shall** be placed in the stadium and commence work until and unless they have passed an ASP criminal background check. ADPT reserves the right to determine if a company employee passes or fails the criminal background check based on the results of the check. If the individual fails they **shall** not be allowed to work or visit the stadium in performance of any contractual duties or responsibilities.
 - f. The apparent low bidder **shall** utilize the ASP Identification Bureau Individual Record Form pursuant to the instructions as stated on the form. The apparent low bidder **shall** send the completed forms directly to ASP once the Anticipation to Award notification is issued. The ASP form is included in this IFB.
 - g. Renewal Periods: ADPT requires, at no cost to the State, current reports, current is defined as background reports which are dated and received by ADPT within (72) hours of being sent by the Arkansas State Police (ASP). Background reports which are not current **will not** be considered, on all individuals that will be placed in the stadium at the start of each contract renewal period. Contractor **shall** complete the Form for each employee and submit it to the ASP not more than thirty (30) days prior to the start of the renewal period. ADPT may supply copies of the criminal background information to OSP upon receipt of documents. Previously provided background checks **will not** be accepted.
 - h. Additional Background Checks: ADPT reserves the right to require, at no cost to the State, additional background checks of any employee at any time during the initial or any subsequent terms of the contract should good cause exist and is provided to the Contractor. ADPT **shall** have sole authority to determine good cause. The Contractor **shall** complete the form and send it directly to the ASP after written notification has been provided. ADPT may supply copies of the criminal background information, when requested, to OSP.

2.5 POLYGRAPH EXAMINATIONS

ADPT reserves the right to have Prospective Contractor's employees take polygraph examinations under the provisions of Public Law #100-347, 29 USC 2001 et. seq. All expenses for polygraph examinations will be at the expense of the successful bidder.

2.6 **PROTECTION OF PROPERTY**

- A. The Contractor **shall** take all precautions necessary to prevent the unauthorized use or pilferage of materials, tools, equipment, fixtures, furnishings, and any other items from the stadium including but not limited to tenant offices and common areas.
- B. Telephones and all other equipment installed in the offices are the property of the State of Arkansas and **must** not be utilized by the Contractor or their employees. Unauthorized use is subject to reimbursement to the State.
- C. The Contractor **shall** be responsible for any loss or damage to the State's property and to the property of other's due to the Contractor's personnel, and shall make good, at his own expense, such loss or damage at the request of ADPT.
- D. The Contractor Supervisor **shall** visually check all employees when entering and leaving the stadium. Except in the case of an emergency or trash removal employees **shall** not exit the stadium until their shift is completed.
- E. Equipment and Materials: The Contractor **shall** be responsible for any loss, damage, or destruction of their own property or that of any equipment and materials used in conjunction with the work performed. The Contractor **shall** purchase at the Contractor's own expense such policy to cover Prospective Contractor's owned property.

2.7 **CLEANING SUPPLIES AND COMPLIANCE**

- A. The Contractor **shall** provide all labor, equipment, and cleaning supplies needed to ensure satisfactory performance of the contract. Cleaning supplies that **must** be provided by the Prospective Contractor include, but are not limited to: glass cleaners, air freshener/dispenser units for restrooms, all sanitizing and cleaning products used by the Prospective Contractor in performance of this contract, and vacuum cleaners with HEPA filters.
- B. The ADPT requests the use of certified green cleaning products to help create a healthy work environment for the janitorial staff and its stadium occupants. The ADPT specifications encourage the most environmentally friendly products with equivalent or higher performance at equal or lower cost than traditional products.
- C. The Contractor **shall** be responsible for receiving, handling, storage, and delivery of all materials and equipment needed for the performance of this contract and maintaining the stadium cleanliness.
- D. Product Safety Data Sheets are to be available, within (24) business hours, when requested by ADPT on all products used by the contractor.

2.8 **INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**

- A. Prior to anticipation to award or when requested by OSP, the Contractor **shall** furnish an approved "Certificate of Insurance" and **must** maintain the following insurance requirement throughout the contract period.
- B. The insurance **must** not be modified without OSP and ADPT approval.
- C. Liability Limits are as follows:

- D. Each Certificate of Insurance **must** name OSP and ADPT as certificate holders with the intent to notify same of any intention to cancel the insurance within ten (10) days.
- E. The Contractor **shall** provide Commercial General Liability insurance with the additional insured endorsement that is primary non-contributory. All policies must contain a waiver of subrogation against the State of Arkansas and the Department of Parks and Tourism arising from work performed by or on behalf of the Contractor.

2.9 **JANITORIAL SERVICE REQUIREMENTS**

A. **SERVICE HOURS**

Janitorial Services are to be provided after scheduled events according to the guidelines in Item 2.3.

B. **ENTRANCE TO THE STADIUM**

The cleaning staff will enter through the main door of the Letterman's Club and the elevator access of the Press Box. When cleaning the restrooms on the concourse the Contractor shall enter at the closest gate to the restrooms and park their vehicle at the adjacent gate. A Contractor Supervisor will be present to allow entry to the stadium.

C. **NON-PERMITTED ENTRANCE TO STADIUM**

1. Visitors or children are not permitted to accompany the Contractor or any Contractor employee while performing janitorial services as required by this IFB.
2. A Contractor or Contractor employee allowing visitors or children in the stadium, while performing janitorial services, will result in a below standard Vendor Performance Report (VPR) being issued to the Contractor in accordance with this IFB.
3. ADPT does not permit weaponry of any type, by the contractor or the contractor's staff, on the stadium premises. Should weaponry be discovered or be involved in any incident, immediate termination of the contractor and/or staff will be given.
4. A Contractor receiving a below standard VPR may be terminated from contract.

2.10 **JANITORIAL TASK LIST**

See attachment "A" – Janitorial Task List.

2.11 **DEFINITION OF TASK AS REQUIRED BY ADPT**

- A. **VACUUM**: The use of a vacuum cleaner (commercial or residential model) to remove debris and/or particles from carpeted areas. The vacuum cleaner should be a HEPA model to reduce allergians and pollutants from being airborne. Carpets shall be clean and free from dust balls, dirt and other debris. NOTE: Prior to vacuuming area, move and vacuum under all easily movable objects (chairs, waste receptacles, tables on wheels). Replace all items moved.
- B. **MOPPING**: The use of a wet mop (cloth, dust, micro-fiber, wooly, cloth strip, etc.) to wipe debris from the floor surface. The use of appropriate floor cleaners per the surface receiving the mopping. Monthly cleaning requirement for the tile floors are to include scrubbing/buffing with water and a mild abrasive (ADPT will provide Ajax). Signage should be utilized (Caution: Wet Floors) when floors are wet or being cleaned. Floors **must** be clean and free of dirt, water streaks, mop marks, strings; properly rinsed and presenting an overall appearance of cleanliness. Baseboards, walls, furniture and equipment **must** in no way be splashed, disfigured or damaged during mopping task.
- C. **SWEEPING**: The use of an appropriate sweeping devise (Straw Broom, Electric Broom, and/or Dust Mop) to remove debris and/or particles from floors other than carpeted areas. Corners, under furniture, and behind doors are to be included in the sweeping process.

- D. GLASS DOORS: Clean with appropriate glass cleaning product solutions and cloth. No streaks or cloth residue visible by the naked eye. Thoroughly clean all glass and mirrors using an approved alcohol based glass cleaner. Squeegee may be used as needed.
- E. DUSTING: The use of appropriate dusting product solution cleaners to be used per the surface receiving the dusting. Dusting devices are to be appropriate for the surface receiving dusting, e.g., soft dusting cloth, feather duster, pre-treated dusting cloth, micro-fiber cloth, etc. Dusting devices **must** not scratch or cause damage to the area receiving treatment. No streaks or cloth residue should be visible by the naked eye. Dust all fixtures, ledges, edges, shelves, exposed pipes, door frames, tops of file cabinets, etc. Areas not cleared by office occupant are **not** to be dusted.
- F. DISPOSE OF TRASH: Remove trash debris from all trash receptacles and deposit in the appropriate containers. The trash dumpsters are located outside Gate 5. Waste receptacles should not, at any time, have an offensive odor due to contents or lack of cleaning methods to the removal of trash. Trash receptacles should be cleaned with appropriate cleaners when needed.
- G. CLEAN STAINLESS ITEMS: The use of appropriate cleaner solutions to clean stainless items in the kitchen/break rooms. The cleaning device should leave no streaks or cloth residue visible by the naked eye.
- H. SANITIZE: The areas receiving treatment (Kitchen, breakrooms, drinking fountains, and restrooms) are cleaned with the appropriate cleaner for sanitizing. Sanitizing cleaning device should leave no streaks or cloth residue visible by the naked eye.
- I. MICROWAVE CLEANED: The inside of microwaves **must** be cleaned with the appropriate cleaner, and the racks removed when needed and washed in warm soapy water. Replace racks cleaned and ready for use. The glass area should be cleaned both inside and out with the appropriate cleaner. No streaks or cloth residue visible by the naked eye. **Do not** use combustible cleaning solutions for cleaning the Microwave. **The Prospective Contractor employees will apply all safety measures regarding the cleaning of an electrical devise.**
- J. REFRIGERATOR CLEANED: Clean the inside of the refrigerator with appropriate cleaners. Including, but not limited to: wiping down the inside of unit, removal of racks and/or wiping racks down, removal of bins and washing thoroughly with warm soapy water, discarding unmarked personal items, discarding out-of-date items. Freezer items are to be checked and discarded should items not be marked or items that have freezer burn. **Do not** use cleaners that are not recommended for food area cleaning. **The Prospective Contractor employees will apply all safety measures regarding the cleaning of an electrical devise.**
- K. REPLENISH INVENTORY: Restock products/inventory for daily use, e.g., restrooms receive: toilet tissue, paper towels, and soap daily.
- L. OVERHEAD LIGHTING AND LIGHT FIXTURES: An extendable cleaning device designed for dusting overhead items should be utilized. Cleaning device **must** not damage or leave residue on the service areas. The use of ladders is discouraged by ADPT. However, if used, please notify ADPT that ladders are being used for this cleaning requirement. Any dust particles that fall to the ground are to be removed through the vacuuming or sweeping process.
- M. DEEP CLEANING: Cleaning methods that include removal of debris in corners, crevices, spiral designs, grout, etc. An exceptionally intense, time required, cleaning process. Appropriate cleaners are to be utilized.
- N. SPOT REMOVAL: Areas that have spots appear are cleaned using the appropriate cleaning equipment/device. Cleaning solutions are to be appropriate for the removal of spots. No solutions should cause damage or offensive odors to the employees. Any solutions that cause further damage to areas receiving the treatment are reported immediately to the Prospective Contractor. Buildup, spillage or crusted material **shall** be removed along with spots, smears and stains. There **shall** be no evidence of “fuzzing” caused by harsh rubbing or brushing of carpet. Spot cleaned areas **shall** blend with adjacent areas. Signage should be used to indicate “wet” or “slippery” area.
- O. SHAMPOOING: Carpeted areas are to be shampooed with the appropriate cleaning machines (Commercial or Residential). Machines should extract excess water, dirt and debris from area receiving service. Cleaning

solutions **must** be appropriate for shampooing the carpets. Neither the cleaning machine nor the solution should cause damage to the areas cleaned. No fuzzing or spotting of carpet should be seen after cleaning and drying of the carpeted areas. Solutions should be environmental safe for employees when they return to work after the cleaning of the carpets. No harsh chemicals are to be used as cleaning solutions. All safety measures **must** be taken by the Prospective Contractor's employees when cleaning carpeted areas. Signage **must** be utilized to indicate "wet" or "slippery" areas.

2.12 **MATERIALS AND SUPPLIES**

A. **PAPER GOODS**

1. ADPT will furnish the paper goods (i.e., toilet paper, paper towels and trash can liners) and soap for the restrooms. These items will be stored in the janitorial closets located in the stadium. The janitorial staff will use as needed throughout the stadium.
2. All other cleaning supplies used to clean the stadium will be provided by the contractor at their expense.
3. Janitorial closets should be kept clean, safe, sanitary, odor free and in a neat manner.

B. **KEYS**

One (1) key will be assigned to janitorial staff and **shall** not be shared with other individuals.

2.13 **REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION**

OSP reserves the right to request required documentation, if not included with the IFB, prior to Anticipation to Award or at a time necessary to complete the review of the lowest responsive, responsible Prospective Contractor. Requested documentation **must** be received by OSP within (72) hours of written or verbal request.

2.14 **PERFORMANCE STANDARDS**

- A. State law requires that all contracts for services include Performance Standards for measuring the overall quality of services provided that a Contractor **must** meet to avoid assessment of damages.
- B. The State may be open to negotiations of Performance Standards prior to contract award, prior to the commencement of services, or at times throughout the contract duration. *Performance Standards* identifies expected deliverables, performance measures, or outcomes; and defines the acceptable standards.
- C. The State has the right to modify, add, or delete Performance Standards throughout the term of the contract, should the State determine it is in its best interest to do so. Any changes or additions to performance standards will be made in good faith following acceptable industry standards, and may include the input of the Contractor to establish standards that are reasonably achievable.
- D. All changes made to the Performance Standards will become an official part of the contract.
- E. Performance Standards will continue throughout the aggregate term of the contract.
- F. Failure to meet the minimum Performance Standards as specified will result in the assessment of damages. In the event a Performance Standard is not met, the Contractor will have the opportunity to defend or respond to the insufficiency. The State has the right to waive damages if it determines there were extenuating factors beyond the control of the Contractor that hindered the performance of services. In these instances, the State has final determination of the performance acceptability.
- G. Should any compensation be owed to the State agency due to the assessment of damages, Contractor **shall** follow the direction of the State agency regarding the required compensation process.

SECTION 3 – GENERAL CONTRACTUAL ITEMS

- **Do not provide responses to items in this section.**

3.1 PAYMENT AND INVOICE PROVISIONS

A. Forward invoices to:

- B. Payment will be made in accordance with applicable State of Arkansas accounting procedures upon acceptance of goods and services by the agency.
- C. Do not invoice the State in advance of delivery and acceptance of any goods or services.
- D. Payment will be made only after the Contractor has successfully satisfied the agency as to the reliability and effectiveness of the goods or services purchased as a whole.
- E. The Contractor should invoice the agency by an itemized list of charges. The agency's Purchase Order Number and/or the Contract Number should be referenced on each invoice.
- F. Other sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional Requirements for invoicing.
- G. Selected Contractor **must** be registered to receive payment and future *Bid Solicitation* notifications. Contractors may register on-line at <https://www.ark.org/contractor/index.html>.

3.2 GENERAL INFORMATION

A. The State will not:

1. Lease any equipment or software for a period of time which continues past the end of a fiscal year unless the contract allows for cancellation by the State Procurement Official upon a 30-day written notice to the Contractor/lessor in the event funds are not appropriated.
2. Contract with another party to indemnify and defend that party for any liability and damages.
3. Pay damages, legal expenses or other costs and expenses of any other party.
4. Continue a contract once any equipment has been repossessed.
5. Agree to any provision of a contract which violates the laws or constitution of the State of Arkansas.
6. Enter a contract which grants to another party any remedies other than the following:
 - a. The right to possession.
 - b. The right to accrued payments.
 - c. The right to expenses of de-installation.
 - d. The right to expenses of repair to return the equipment to normal working order, normal wear and tear excluded.
 - e. The right to recover only amounts due at the time of repossession and any unamortized nonrecurring cost as allowed by Arkansas Law.

- B. Any litigation involving the State **must** take place in Pulaski County, Arkansas.
- C. The laws of the State of Arkansas govern this contract.

- D. A contract is not effective prior to award being made by a State Procurement Official.
- E. In a contract with another party, the State will accept the risk of loss of the equipment or software and pay for any destruction, loss, or damage of the equipment or software while the State has such risk, when:
 - The extent of liability for such risk is based upon the purchase price of the equipment or software at the time of any loss, and
 - The contract has required the State to carry insurance for such risk.

3.3 **CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT**

- A. Observe and comply with federal and State of Arkansas laws, local laws, ordinances, orders, and regulations existing at the time of, or enacted subsequent to the execution of a resulting contract which in any manner affect the completion of the work.
- B. Indemnify and save harmless the agency and all its officers, representatives, agents, and employees against any claim or liability arising from or based upon the violation of any such law, ordinance, regulation, order or decree by an employee, representative, or subcontractor of the Contractor.

3.4 **STATEMENT OF LIABILITY**

- A. The State will demonstrate reasonable care but will not be liable in the event of loss, destruction or theft of Contractor-owned equipment or software and technical and business or operations literature to be delivered or to be used in the installation of deliverables and services. The Contractor will retain total liability for equipment, software and technical and business or operations literature. The State will not at any time be responsible for or accept liability for any Contractor-owned items.
- B. The Contractor's liability for damages to the State will be limited to the value of the Contract or \$5,000,000, whichever is higher. The foregoing limitation of liability will not apply to claims for infringement of United States patent, copyright, trademarks or trade secrets; to claims for personal injury or damage to property caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Contractor; to claims covered by other specific provisions of the Contract calling for damages; or to court costs or attorney's fees awarded by a court in addition to damages after litigation based on the Contract. The Contractor and the State will not be liable to each other, regardless of the form of action, for consequential, incidental, indirect, or special damages. This limitation of liability will not apply to claims for infringement of United States patent, copyright, trademark or trade secrets; to claims for personal injury or damage to property caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Contractor; to claims covered by other specific provisions of the Contract calling for damages; or to court costs or attorney's fees awarded by a court in addition to damages after litigation based on the Contract.
- C. Language in these terms and conditions **must not** be construed or deemed as the State's waiver of its right of sovereign immunity. The Contractor agrees that any claims against the State, whether sounding in tort or in contract, will be brought before the Arkansas Claims Commission as provided by Arkansas law and governed accordingly.

3.5 **RECORD RETENTION**

- A. Maintain all pertinent financial and accounting records and evidence pertaining to the contract in accordance with generally accepted principles of accounting and as specified by the State of Arkansas Law. Upon request, grant access to State or Federal Government entities or any of their duly authorized representatives.
- B. Make financial and accounting records available, upon request, to the State of Arkansas's designee(s) at any time during the contract period and any extension thereof, and for five (5) years from expiration date and final payment on the contract or extension thereof.
- C. Other sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional Requirements regarding record retention.

3.6 PRICE ESCALATION

- A. Price increases will be considered at the time of contract renewal.
- B. The Contractor **must** provide to OSP a written request for the price increase. The request **must** include supporting documentation demonstrating that the increase in contract price is based on an increase in market price. OSP has the right to require additional information pertaining to the requested increase.
- C. Increases will not be considered to increase profit or margins.
- D. OSP has the right to approve or deny the request.

3.7 CONFIDENTIALITY

- A. The Contractor, Contractor's subsidiaries, and Contractor's employees will be bound to all laws and to all Requirements set forth in this *Bid Solicitation* concerning the confidentiality and secure handling of information of which they may become aware of during the course of providing services under a resulting contract.
- B. Consistent and/or uncorrected breaches of confidentiality may constitute grounds for cancellation of a resulting contract, and the State has the right to cancel the contract on these grounds.
- C. Previous sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional confidentiality Requirements.

3.8 CONTRACT INTERPRETATION

Should the State and Contractor interpret specifications differently, either party may request clarification. However, if an agreement cannot be reached, the determination of the State is final and controlling.

3.9 CANCELLATION

- A. For Cause. The State may cancel any contract resulting from this solicitation for cause when the Contractor fails to perform its obligations under it by giving the Contractor written notice of such cancellation at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of proposed cancellation. In any written notice of cancellation for cause, the State will advise the Contractor in writing of the reasons why the State is considering cancelling the contract and provide the Contractor with an opportunity to avoid cancellation for cause by curing any deficiencies identified in the notice of cancellation for cause prior to the date of proposed cancellation. To the extent permitted by law and at the discretion of the parties, the parties may agree to **minor amendments to** the contract and avoid the cancellation for cause upon mutual agreement.
- B. For Convenience. The State may cancel any contract resulting from the solicitation by giving the Contractor written notice of such cancellation sixty (60) days prior to the date of cancellation.
- C. If upon cancellation the Contractor has provided commodities or services which the State of Arkansas has accepted, and there are no funds legally available to pay for the commodities or services, the Contractor may file a claim with the Arkansas Claims Commission under the laws and regulations governing the filing of such claims.

3.10 SEVERABILITY

If any provision of the contract, including items incorporated by reference, is declared or found to be illegal, unenforceable, or void, then both the agency and the Contractor will be relieved of all obligations arising under such provision. If the remainder of the contract is capable of performance, it will not be affected by such declaration or finding and **must** be fully performed.

SECTION 4 – STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- *Do not provide responses to items in this section.*
- 1. **GENERAL:** Any special terms and conditions included in this solicitation **shall** override these Standard Terms and Conditions. The Standard Terms and Conditions and any special terms and conditions **shall** become part of any contract entered into if any or all parts of the bid are accepted by the State of Arkansas.
- 2. **ACCEPTANCE AND REJECTION:** The State **shall** have the right to accept or reject all or any part of a bid or any and all bids, to waive minor technicalities, and to award the bid to best serve the interest of the State.
- 3. **BID SUBMISSION:** Original Bid Packets **must** be submitted to the Office of State Procurement on or before the date and time specified for bid opening. The Bid Packet **must** contain all documents, information, and attachments as specifically and expressly required in the *Bid Solicitation*. The bid **must** be typed or printed in ink. The signature **must** be in ink. Unsigned bids **shall** be disqualified. The person signing the bid should show title or authority to bind his firm in a contract. Multiple bids **must** be placed in separate packages and should be completely and properly identified. Late bids **shall not** be considered under any circumstances.
- 4. **PRICES:** Bid unit price F.O.B. destination. In case of errors in extension, unit prices **shall** govern. Prices **shall** be firm and **shall not** be subject to escalation unless otherwise specified in the *Bid Solicitation*. Unless otherwise specified, the bid **must** be firm for acceptance for thirty days from the bid opening date. "Discount from list" bids are not acceptable unless requested in the *Bid Solicitation*.
- 5. **QUANTITIES:** Quantities stated in a *Bid Solicitation* for term contracts are estimates only, and are not guaranteed. Contractor **must** bid unit price on the estimated quantity and unit of measure specified. The State may order more or less than the estimated quantity on term contracts. Quantities stated on firm contracts are actual Requirements of the ordering agency.
- 6. **BRAND NAME REFERENCES:** Unless otherwise specified in the *Bid Solicitation*, any catalog brand name or manufacturer reference used in the *Bid Solicitation* is descriptive only, not restrictive, and used to indicate the type and quality desired. Bids on brands of like nature and quality will be considered. If bidding on other than referenced specifications, the bid **must** show the manufacturer, brand or trade name, and other descriptions, and should include the manufacturer's illustrations and complete descriptions of the product offered. The State **shall** have the right to determine whether a substitute offered is equivalent to and meets the standards of the item specified, and the State may require the Contractor to supply additional descriptive material. The Contractor **shall** guarantee that the product offered will meet or exceed specifications identified in this *Bid Solicitation*. Contractors not bidding an alternate to the referenced brand name or manufacturer **shall** be required to furnish the product according to brand names, numbers, etc., as specified in the solicitation.
- 7. **GUARANTY:** All items bid **shall** be newly manufactured, in first-class condition, latest model and design, including, where applicable, containers suitable for shipment and storage, unless otherwise indicated in the *Bid Solicitation*. The Contractor hereby guarantees that everything furnished hereunder **shall** be free from defects in design, workmanship and material, that if sold by drawing, sample or specification, it **shall** conform thereto and **shall** serve the function for which it was furnished. The Contractor **shall** further guarantee that if the items furnished hereunder are to be installed by the Contractor, such items **shall** function properly when installed. The Contractor **shall** guarantee that all applicable laws have been complied with relating to construction, packaging, labeling and registration. The Contractor's obligations under this paragraph **shall** survive for a period of one year from the date of delivery, unless otherwise specified herein.
- 8. **SAMPLES:** Samples or demonstrators, when requested, **must** be furnished free of expense to the State. Each sample should be marked with the Contractor's name and address, bid or contract number and item number. If requested, samples that are not destroyed during reasonable examination will be returned at Contractor's expense. After reasonable examination, all demonstrators will be returned at Contractor's expense.
- 9. **TESTING PROCEDURES FOR SPECIFICATIONS COMPLIANCE:** Tests may be performed on samples or demonstrators submitted with the bid or on samples taken from the regular shipment. In the event products tested fail to meet or exceed all conditions and Requirements of the specifications, the cost of the sample used and the reasonable cost of the testing **shall** be borne by the Contractor.
- 10. **AMENDMENTS:** Contractor's bids cannot be altered or amended after the bid opening except as permitted by regulation.
- 11. **TAXES AND TRADE DISCOUNTS:** Do not include State or local sales taxes in the bid price. Trade discounts should be deducted from the unit price and the net price should be shown in the bid.
- 12. **AWARD:** Term Contract: A contract award will be issued to the successful Contractor. It results in a binding obligation without further action by either party. This award does not authorize shipment. Shipment is authorized by the receipt of a purchase order from the ordering agency. Firm Contract: A written State purchase order authorizing shipment will be furnished to the successful Contractor.
- 13. **DELIVERY ON FIRM CONTRACTS:** This solicitation shows the number of days to place a commodity in the ordering agency's designated location under normal conditions. If the Contractor cannot meet the stated delivery, alternate delivery schedules may become a factor in an award. The Office of State Procurement **shall** have the right to extend delivery if reasons appear valid. If the date is not acceptable, the agency may buy elsewhere and any additional cost **shall** be borne by the Contractor.

- 14. DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS:** No substitutions or cancellations are permitted without written approval of the Office of State Procurement. Delivery **shall** be made during agency work hours only 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Central Time, unless prior approval for other delivery has been obtained from the agency. Packing memoranda **shall** be enclosed with each shipment.
- 15. STORAGE:** The ordering agency is responsible for storage if the Contractor delivers within the time required and the agency cannot accept delivery.
- 16. DEFAULT:** All commodities furnished **shall** be subject to inspection and acceptance of the ordering agency after delivery. Back orders, default in promised delivery, or failure to meet specifications **shall** authorize the Office of State Procurement to cancel this contract or any portion of it and reasonably purchase commodities elsewhere and charge full increase, if any, in cost and handling to the defaulting Contractor. The Contractor **must** give written notice to the Office of State Procurement and ordering agency of the reason and the expected delivery date. Consistent failure to meet delivery without a valid reason may cause removal from the Contractors list or suspension of eligibility for award.
- 17. VARIATION IN QUANTITY:** The State assumes no liability for commodities produced, processed or shipped in excess of the amount specified on the agency's purchase order.
- 18. INVOICING:** The Contractor **shall** be paid upon the completion of all of the following: (1) submission of an original and the specified number of copies of a properly itemized invoice showing the bid and purchase order numbers, where itemized in the *Bid Solicitation*, (2) delivery and acceptance of the commodities and (3) proper and legal processing of the invoice by all necessary State agencies. Invoices **must** be sent to the "Invoice To" point shown on the purchase order.
- 19. STATE PROPERTY:** Any specifications, drawings, technical information, dies, cuts, negatives, positives, data or any other commodity furnished to the Contractor hereunder or in contemplation hereof or developed by the Contractor for use hereunder **shall** remain property of the State, **shall** be kept confidential, **shall** be used only as expressly authorized, and **shall** be returned at the Contractor's expense to the F.O.B. point provided by the agency or by OSP. Contractor **shall** properly identify items being returned.
- 20. PATENTS OR COPYRIGHTS:** The Contractor **must** agree to indemnify and hold the State harmless from all claims, damages and costs including attorneys' fees, arising from infringement of patents or copyrights.
- 21. ASSIGNMENT:** Any contract entered into pursuant to this solicitation **shall not** be assignable nor the duties thereunder delegable by either party without the written consent of the other party of the contract.
- 22. CLAIMS:** Any claims the Contractor may assert under this Agreement **shall** be brought before the Arkansas State Claims Commission ("Commission"), which **shall** have exclusive jurisdiction over any and all claims that the Contractor may have arising from or in connection with this Agreement. Unless the Contractor's obligations to perform are terminated by the State, the Contractor **shall** continue to provide the Services under this Agreement even in the event that the Contractor has a claim pending before the Commission.
- 23. CANCELLATION:** In the event, the State no longer needs the commodities or services specified for any reason, (e.g., program changes; changes in laws, rules or regulations; relocation of offices; lack of appropriated funding, etc.), the State **shall** have the right to cancel the contract or purchase order by giving the Contractor written notice of such cancellation thirty (30) days prior to the date of cancellation.
- Any delivered but unpaid for goods will be returned in normal condition to the Contractor by the State. If the State is unable to return the commodities in normal condition and there are no funds legally available to pay for the goods, the Contractor may file a claim with the Arkansas Claims Commission under the laws and regulations governing the filing of such claims. If upon cancellation the Contractor has provided services which the State has accepted, the Contractor may file a claim. **NOTHING IN THIS CONTRACT SHALL BE DEEMED A WAIVER OF THE STATE'S RIGHT TO SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.**
- 24. DISCRIMINATION:** In order to comply with the provision of Act 954 of 1977, relating to unfair employment practices, the Contractor agrees that: (a) the Contractor **shall not** discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, sex, color, age, religion, handicap, or national origin; (b) in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the Contractor **shall** state that all qualified applicants **shall** receive consideration without regard to race, color, sex, age, religion, handicap, or national origin; (c) the Contractor will furnish such relevant information and reports as requested by the Human Resources Commission for the purpose of determining compliance with the statute; (d) failure of the Contractor to comply with the statute, the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder and this nondiscrimination clause **shall** be deemed a breach of contract and it may be cancelled, terminated or suspended in whole or in part; (e) the Contractor **shall** include the provisions of above items (a) through (d) in every subcontract so that such provisions **shall** be binding upon such subcontractor or Contractor.
- 25. CONTINGENT FEE:** The Contractor guarantees that he has not retained a person to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies maintained by the Contractor for the purpose of securing business.
- 26. ANTITRUST ASSIGNMENT:** As part of the consideration for entering into any contract pursuant to this solicitation, the Contractor named on the *Bid Signature Page* for this solicitation, acting herein by the authorized individual or its duly authorized agent, hereby assigns, sells and transfers to the State of Arkansas all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action it may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or this State for price fixing, which causes of action have accrued prior to the date of this

assignment and which relate solely to the particular goods or services purchased or produced by this State pursuant to this contract.

- 27. DISCLOSURE:** Failure to make any disclosure required by Governor's Executive Order 98-04, or any violation of any rule, regulation, or policy adopted pursuant to that order, **shall** be a material breach of the terms of this contract. Any Contractor, whether an individual or entity, who fails to make the required disclosure or who violates any rule, regulation, or policy **shall** be subject to all legal remedies available to the agency.
