Information Technology (IT) Staff Augmentation Contract

Fact Sheet

The IT Staff Augmentation Contract became effective on October 6, 2006. Implementation and training will occur over the next several weeks, with a targeted Go Live date of December 1, 2006. The following information should assist you and your staff when using the contract.

The Contract:

The contractor is Computer Aid, Inc (CAI). They are a Managed Service Provider of IT staff augmentation services. CAI will manage an open vendor network of more than 70 IT Staffing and IT Services subcontractors to deliver contract resources on a Time and Materials (T&M) basis to the State of Arkansas.

The State of Arkansas required that CAI have an "open" network of subcontractors. Open is defined as permitting any supplier to become a part of the network at any time during the term of the contract as long as they agree to the terms and conditions of the contract and pricing. State of Arkansas Agencies will have the right to request a particular subcontractor and/or a particular IT resource, if that individual is available and the subcontractor is an approved company in CAI's subcontractor network. The Scope:
